KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

ASSESSING COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS

- In partnership with Community Progress Council and York College Center for Community Engagement, 11 focus groups were held in targeted locations throughout the County of York. The goal of the focus groups was to gather additional information from community members around social determinant of health needs.
- Those locations included Hanover, City of York, Delta/Fawn Grove, Hallam and Lewisberry with additional sessions conducted for Spanish speaking residents.
- Over 40 individuals provided feedback on issues such as overall well being, childcare, transportation, housing, food and employment.

CONVENING COMMUNITY PARTNERS

- Hosted "Community Conversation-Working Together to Improve Community Health & Well Being " on Tues. April 18th where over 135 attendees heard from presenters around closed loop referral systems from health care organizations. This event was a kick-off event for York County Care Coordination Project, which is a systems level project intended to improve community health through social determinants of health care coordination, bi-directional referrals and shared intake.
- Convened 4 Leadership Council meetings where presentations and coalition priorities were discussed. Topics included community based mental well being programs, CHNA focus group findings, post pandemic implications on public programs and mental health awareness month.
- Conducted environmental scans to inform health care and community partners on Community Health Improvement Plan areas in York County including housing, charitable food system, mental health services and public health.
- In partnership with the York County Coroner and Child Death Review Team, we have convened over 10 meetings with community partners to conduct an environmental scan regarding gun safety. Gap analysis and collaborative partners are being identified to further this important work.

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS


ADVOCATING FOR INCREASED PUBLIC HEALTH INFASTRUCTURE

- Conducted presentation with elected leaders on the importance of public health countywide.
- The Blue-Ribbon Panel Advisory Committee drafted a research proposal for a stipend Ph.D. intern to conduct additional research around increasing York County Public Health infrastructure. The intended outcome of the proposal is to solidify additional information on countywide public health infrastructure and opportunities. Report publication forthcoming.

- Healthy York partnered with Tobacco Free York Co and Rep. Carol Hill Evans to hold a press conference and make a proclamation in support of the Great American Smoke Out on Nov. 17.
- With the support of Alliance for Personal Care Advancement (ALPHA)
 we successfully drafted and completed a transition plan for ALPHA
 to become a stand alone organization.


